

Mark Carr Scholarship Award

The **Mark Carr Scholarship Award** honors the memory of Mark Carr, former Fire Chief of New Britain, CT. Carr was dedicated to bringing a high level of competence to the New Britain Fire Department through training, continuous education, and fostering community spirit. Prior to his passing in August 2014, Mark Carr worked in the Homeland Security sector in Washington, DC where he was responsible for overseeing disaster preparedness, response, and security for the nation. The Mark Carr Scholarship Award was created to continue the legacy of public service that defined his life as well as his passion for continuous learning.

The Mark Carr scholarship award aims to foster education and support for individuals undertaking Public Safety Administration Education, or where students pursue studies to eventually work in the public sector in the field of homeland security, emergency management, or fire sciences.

Scholarship Eligibility Criteria:

- The scholarship award is open to any **full-time or part-time** Charter Oak State College **student** currently participating in the **Public Safety** Administration Program.
- Preference given to **students who have completed at least six months** of study in the Public Safety Administration Program.
- Applicants must have a **minimum B grade** or cumulative grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent.
- Scholarships will be distributed in the amount of \$500 and must be used for tuition and fees.
- Scholarship funds are not renewable.

Scholarship Application Process:

Applicants must provide the following materials on or before the application deadline. No late or incomplete submissions will be considered.

- Confirmation letter or document from Charter Oak Advisor that you are participating in PSA
 Education. The letter must indicate your designated field of study, current grade point average,
 anticipated graduation date and degree, and be signed by the Charter Oak Advisor.
- One letter of reference attesting to the applicant's character, leadership and academic ability, and must indicate the relationship between the reference and the applicant. (An immediate family member may not submit reference letters.)
- A 500-word essay indicating the applicant's interest in the designated field of study.
- A completed application form.
- The complete packet must be received by <u>Sunday, September 15, 2019</u> for awards that will be applicable to the current academic year.
